Anton Bauer Rosé 2018 Zweigelt/Merlot/Syrah

Clear, light pink with a stimulating fragrant floral and berry nose. The wine has an elegant structure. It is round and soft on the palate with a clean dry finish. A marvelous patio wine for long spring and summer evenings searching for an invitation to dinner.

Steininger Cabernet Sauvignon Rosé 2018

Beautiful salmon rosé color, on the nose filled with dark red berries and cassis, following through on the palate with nice structure. Medium bodied and elegant, although perceptible density in the finish.

An aromatic and refreshing wine.



Tegernseerhof 2017 Pinot Noir Rosé Federspiel - Wachau



2017 is the first vintage of this expressive Pinot Noir Rosé - mineral, tight & animating at the same time it convinces you within the first sip. With its cool flavors, refreshing acidity balance and fine tannins it shows its potential for maturing. A great wine for great occasions.



VINEYARD: The vineyard is called Hinterseiber, just above Steinriegel, which is situated in Weissenkirchen - it has a quite high altitude of 400 meter, cooler climate and a barren limestone soil. This moderate drought stress situation enhances the complexity later in the wine.

VINIFICATION: Harvested by hand, after 3 hours on the skin we gently press the clusters and ferment the must in stainless steel tanks to keep the tension.



Jalits *Kekfrankos* Rose 2017, (Blaufränkisch from Hungary)

Aromas of wild strawberries and cherries. On the palate a perfect balance of the fruit and the acidity. A great sipper and perfect with spicy food.



Secco Sparkling Rosé



Pinot Noir crafted into a sparkling rose wine made in the **ProSecco** style.

It has delicate aromas of fresh strawberries and red berries, which follow through on the palate.

The flavors are beautifully balanced with a vibrant and refreshingly **dry** finish.

Steininger Young Rosé (Sparkling Wine)

Zweigelt, Pinot Noir and Cabernet Sauvignon are directly pressed after a short skin contact.

A delicate but very animating mousseux. This is a refreshing and aromatic “sparkling wine”

The grapes for the YOUNG Rosé are from sustainably managed vineyards and have a sustainability certification. Beautiful salmon color, dry with hints of red currant, taste of red currant, blackberry and strawberry fruit, it is crisp and refreshing on the finish.

The perfect “Bubbly” for any occasion!



Paul D Frizzante Rosé Sparkling Zweigelt rosé

Color: bright salmon-orange **Nose:** citrus notes, pasture grasses, blackberry

Taste: fresh, good fruit, balanced acidity combined with wild berries

Frizzante describe the level of effervescence (i.e. the strength of the bubbles) in a bottle of sparkling wine. Wines labeled ‘frizzante’ are what we call gently sparkling. Frizzante wines have between 2.5 and 3.5 bars of atmosphere/pressure while Spumante, most Prosecco's and Champagne are usually between 5 and 6 bars. Frizzante wines are known as ‘Perlant’ in French and as ‘Perlwein’ in German. Prosecco is probably the most well-known frizzante wine style, but most Prosecco wines usually are made fully sparkling (spumante)
