In the beginning the young winemaker cultivated 35 hectare of agriculture and 4-hectare vineyards but was able to increase these numbers fivefold within 10 years.

In the meantime, Paul is father of two children and leads the winery together with his wife Romana in fourth generation, always growing with the changes of time. Both children, already now, look over Paul's shoulders whenever they can and are curious about every day's work in the vineyards and the cellar. With responsibility, thoughtfulness when it comes to sustainability and great love for wine, Paul wants to introduce the people to a piece of Austrian quality of life with his wines.

The natural conditions create the best conditions for the pressing of full-bodied and aromatic wines. In our assortment you will find a variety of wines that provide substance and drinking pleasure, from the hearty, spicy Grüner Veltliner to our sparkling Riesling and our Rosé Frizzante.



OUR WHITE ONES

Grüner Veltliner is by far the most important white wine variety in Austria and also at the Wagram. The deep Löss-soil in our vineyards Hundsbergg and Kirchenfels give rise to an exceptionally light and lovely acidic wine, which is fresh and crisp to drink. At the Schlossberg in Mitterstockstall, which is not only impressive with its view, a rich and powerful Grüner Veltliner is growing. Therefore, we at the end have three different Grüner Veltliner in our assortment, ranging from light to strong and each by itself is a pure drinking pleasure.

Besides the Grüner Veltliner, we also produce a pleasurable mild Fröhrotter Veltliner in our cellars, which is an autochthonous grape variety and hence a typical „Austrian“.

Rosé Frizzante, Rosé and our red one, the Zweigelt

The grape variety Zweigelt is the most common and widespread red wine variety in Austria and thrives and grows also in our vineyards. From the Zweigelt-grapes, rising at the sunny places in our single vineyard Hammer, we produce not only our Zweigelt, the classic red wine, but also our verily easy-to-drink and fine Rosé wine.

From the said Rosé wine we also produce our great Rosé Frizzante, which perfectly suits as aperitif and already provided the finishing touch for the one or the other event, such as weddings, birthday parties or simply a leisurely come together.

The name „Wagram“ is derived from „Wogenrain“, which means seashore and refers to the special soil condition in the region. Numerous layers of „Loess“ (fine sands and sediments) are covering residues of ancient oceans and river gravel. The terrain terrasse resulted hereby shapes the landscape.

Our wines are characterized by the geography and geology of the Wagram region with its fertile Loess-soil and the beneficial climate conditions. The nature provides best prerequisites for producing full-bodied and tasteful wines. Especially the Grüner Veltliner grape matures at the Wagram to savory, aromatic wines combining substance and drinking pleasure



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
