

GEMISCHTER SATZ 2021

vineyard name and soil composition: Several plots located directly next to each other in *Gumpoldskirchen* (*Ried Birngarten*), meagre alluvial gravel with a high limestone content.

elevation: 310 m
exposure: south-east
average age of vines: 35 years

the story: Gemischter Satz translates to *'field blend'* and is a vineyard in which different varieties grow together. The grapes are handpicked and vinified as one wine (unlike a Cuvée blend).

grape varieties: Grüner Veltliner 35 %, Riesling 20 %, Welschriesling 20 %, Neuburger 10 %, Pinot blanc 10 %, Sauvignon Blanc 5 %

wine production: Harvested mostly by hand, then destemmed and crushed. Four hours macerating on the skins in the press; both free run must and press must were used, while the final must of the pressing was separated. Fermented with cultured yeast, chilled to 17-19 °C. Fermentation took 19 days. Racking from the heavy lees 14 days when fermentation has finished. Aged on fine lees for six months, followed by bentonite fining, gentle filtering and bottling.

alcoholic content: 12.0 % Vol.
total acidity: 6.6 g/l
residual sugar: 5.0 g/l
potential: until 2025

tasting notes: Elegant, delicate scent of ripe apples, orange blossom and warm hayflowers. Lovely, juicy palate, pears, elderflower and some blossom honey. Generous and round, but with a beautiful fresh zesty finish.

food pairing: A great summer sipper, but goes well alongside light dishes, salads, & appetizers. Cheers!

Ideal temperature to drink: slightly chilled at 10 - 12 °C (50- 54 °F)
